Brief profile on the artists exhibiting :

Joe (Johan) Joubert was born in the Kalahari district of South Africa in 1963. He studied Graphic Design at the Bloemfontein Technikon. After graduating, he worked as a freelance graphic designer before beginning a career as a full-time, oil painting artist. 'I consider myself self-taught, and studied the old masters obsessively, learning to draw and paint, using their techniques.'

His major influences centreon the surrealistic movement, including artists like Salvador Dali, Rene Magritte, Hyronomous Bosch, Jean Arp and SA artist Keith Alexander. 'What I paint is attitude to humanity, reflected through nature, observing the confrontation between man and nature, the real and the sub-conscious. I draw my inspiration from the absolute, not culture or social demands. I am not in awe of perfection, knowing it is unobtainable.'

Karl Staub says about himself : 'I've only started painting seriously about five years ago, before that I had only really painted whilst at school. Other than that, I've never really had any formal art training...they (my paintings) were missing something totally unique. Out of frustration, I started painting what I call my "kugul style". Five years down the line, these women have become less like caricatures, their line work a lot more calculated and refined...they are more elegant, but always with a hint of flamboyancy and "joy d'vivre".' Karl was the featured artist in the May/June 2003 Habitat Magazine.

Richard Scott was born in 1968. 'I want to be unique. I want to lead the way. I want to paint my thoughts on canvas in the most simple, colorful and pure way.' Richard spent 7 years as a technical illustrator. In 1995 he started a business that has today become one of

Cape Town's top internet companies. In 2001 he married Salomien and started to paint seriously. His inspirations are :

-His wife, Salomien. 'No words can describe her...'

-Hearing people say 'I wish I did that!'

-Paul Gauguin - painting masses of flat color.

-Life itself

-The sea

Richard's work has been featured in **GQ** Magazine, **Style** Magazine (refer opening paragraph) and **Habitat** Magazine, and had a very successful exhibition at the Lennox Gallery in London.

Vivien Kohler was born in 1976 and grew up on the Cape Flats. He studied Graphic Design at Peninsula Technikon and Ruth Prowse College of Art & Design. The words 'You must stop drawing pretty pictures and start designing...' has driven him away from the field he studied, into exploring new avenues like silkscreen printing, model building,

illustration for which he has received recognition from Australia ('Viewpoints in Time 2000 Calender') to Canada (AWID– Association of Women In Development). 'I am influenced by Creation – its shapes, shades, patterns, colors and moods...I have never seen my work as abstract, I can't even say that I particularly like abstract art...'

Eric Duplan was born in Bayonne, France in 1962. He spent his childhood in the DRC and studied at the School of Arts in Johannesburg. Duplan's early career involved illustration work mainly for advertising houses, stained glass windows and a number of murals including trompe l'oeil for a hotel in Ostende, Belgium. Eric has been working in oils from his studio on a West Coast farm for thirteen years, working mainly on large landscapes, seascapes and architectural 'aerial' maps, which he re-interprets into figures and objects. He now lives in Pretoria, he is represented in innumerable corporate and private collections, both here and internationally.

Grosvenor Villa Art Gallery

Grosvenor Villa is an historical landmark nestled alongside the Zandvlei Nature Reserve & Bird Sanctuary (Lakeside, Cape Town). This charming gallery offers you a unique collection of paintings, sculptures and bronzes, reflecting the soul of our country. Part of the original Raapkraal farm, it used to serve as the halfway station between Simonstown and Cape Town. It is also the last house of its kind in this area a tin cottage. It features an impressive list of visitors through the last century, e.g. Ian Smith, Prime Minister of the former Rhodesia.

The Zandvlei Reserve protects a variety of wildlife, including rare species of birds and vegetation.
